## FULLY KNOWN; FULLY LOVED

Sharing Easter together: for all of Christian history, this spring reminder of Jesus' resurrection highlights again the ever-present power of God's love and eternal care. And yet, so much still feels out of whack. Pain, sorrow and oppression still run rampant; too many suffer still from rumbling discontent, active warzones, unsolved issues and unresolved conflict; too much remains undone, mysterious, dangling and discordant.

All this is true; and our Christian callings urge us to care, to pray and to faithfully work to heal this hurting world. Simultaneously, we are called to lean in, to wonder, to pause in our confusion and attempt to give thanks for what we do know and can understand.

And ... for the many things in our lives we have trouble understanding, I'm always encouraged by these words from I Corinthians 13:12:

For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. So faith, hope, love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

In spite of the many unknowns we still face, and despite the struggles, may your life be filled to overflowing with God's love this month, fully known and deeply aware that you are completely, unconditionally loved.

Because of this, we can and will continue to share in God's love together and however we can with brothers and sisters in other places. Thanks to your generosity and continued prayers, we have the following Easter greeting from Pastor Andrei in Ukraine (over the last eighteen months, our church and Christmas on Clairemont offering has contributed over \$75,000 to Andrei's congregation for refugee ministry assistance). Here are his words:

Dear Pastor David and brothers and sisters of First Baptist Church of Decatur, As we approach this Easter season, our hearts are heavy with the weight of the ongoing war here in Ukraine. The conflict has brought devastation and loss to many innocent civilians in many Ukrainian cities, especially Kyiv, Odessa, Dnipro, Kryvyi Rih, and many others lately. Despite the chaos and fear that surrounds us, we find comfort in knowing that the Lord has been protecting us here in Vinnytsia from the dangers of rockets and drones. Moreover, due to your prayers and financial support we have been able to help many others who ended up in bad circumstances. Therefore we thank you for all the prayers you lift up for us and for all the people in Ukraine and for your financial support.

Amid all the turmoil and sorrow, we are reminded of the ultimate sacrifice and victory of our Savior, Jesus Christ. His resurrection brings hope and light into the darkest of times, reminding us that even during the war, God's love and grace shine through.

As we celebrate Easter, we hold onto the promise of new life and redemption that comes through Christ's resurrection. We lift our voices in praise and thanksgiving for the hope and peace that He brings, even in the midst of uncertainty and fear.

May this Easter be a time of worship, praise, and rejoicing as we remember the incredible gift of salvation that we have received through Jesus Christ. May His love and grace sustain us through every trial and challenge that we face, knowing that He is always with us, guiding and protecting us through it all.

## PHASE TWO OF FBCD STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS

Phase One of our FBCD strategic planning process was completed with the report and findings of Group Solutions, which was shared with our congregation over three meetings and at a January Deacon's Council gathering.

Phase Two has begun with the approval of the Deacon's Council to form eight working groups to develop separate plans to address areas of need identified during Phase One.

Phase Three, the final phase, will blend the work of the eight working groups into a unified strategic plan\* to be presented to the congregation for review and consideration in July.

Over the next two months, April and May, the focus will be on the working group activities. These working groups members will include Deacon Council members, church staff, and congregation volunteers. Each working group should have 8-10 members.

We envision three meetings of each working group on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm of April 17, May 1, and May 22. Dinner will be provided and a room set aside for each group. In order to accommodate these meetings, Bible Study will not meet on these dates.

Your involvement is much needed. Please know that your participation is welcomed.

\*The final strategic plan will be for the period of July 2024-December 2026.

#### Strategic Plan Working Groups:

• \*Strategic Plan working group. This group will provide coordination of the working groups and will use input from these working groups to draft a 2.5-year strategic plan for our church.

• **Children's working groups**. A need was unanimously identified for an emphasis on and rebuilding of our Children's program. This group would draft a 2.5-year plan to accomplish this. (Created at Church Conference on January 31).

• Youth working group. A need was also unanimously identified for an emphasis on and rebuilding of our Youth program. The Youth working group would also draft a 2.5-year plan to accomplish these goals. (Created at the Church Conference on January 31.)

• Marketing working group. Our church needs to be better known and understood in our Decatur Community. An overall marketing plan that combines the use of various communication vehicles, especially social media, is a high priority. Funds will need to be invested in paid media. (created at Church Conference on January 31).

• \*Missions and Ministries working group. Our church needs to make some difficult decisions and prioritize our outreach activities. We are overextended given our current size and financial base. This will be a challenging assignment.

• \*Organizational & Governance working group. The church decision-making and implementation authority needs to be more efficient. Given a small staff, a more efficient and effective process of decisions on administrative and management issues is needed. A better understanding and communication of authorities would be welcome.

• \*Buildings & Grounds working group. Given the age of our buildings and estimates of future capital/-

maintenance investments this area cannot be ignored. A practical 2.5-year plan for addressing many mechanical and maintenance issues is critical.

• \*First School/First Camp working group. On a consolidated basis these two church ministries provide over 50% of the church revenue and provide educational services to over 175 children. It is important that we continue to provide a high level of educational opportunities thru these ministries. A 2.5-year plan with goals and objectives to enhance the schools should be prepared by this working group.

## A NOTE FROM YOUR LIBRARIAN

Our church here at 1st Baptist has so much to offer to members, but also to non-members. We have been blessed with space, programs, dedicated staff and members, opportunities, financial resources and so many other possibilities to share the Good News of Jesus. Our responsibility, according to Jesus is to go and tell.

Seems to me that we have the equipment here to carry out this command that Jesus gave, but are we meeting this opportunity? Sure, we have quite a few things that need tweaking—(sprucing up certain areas to make them tidier and more inviting). The children's areas are good examples, but the basics and foundation are here. I am considering what I want to do personally, but also what part I can contribute to make our library more accessible. We have a wonderful resource in Allen Memorial Library, but we need folks to use it.

Think about our church and what needs to be done to reach others for Jesus. What legacy do we want left for the next generation???
